It will be crowded and noisy as people enter the building, but I can wear headphones and bring a comfort item.




I should not bring my own food or drink, but I may be able to buy some at the theater.




Attending a Live Theater Performance

I need to silence my phone and anything that might make noise during the performance.




The lights will dim when the show is ready to start. I will watch quietly so everyone can enjoy the performance.
